Theme: Our Favourite Fairytales

Throughout this term we will be learning about Fairytales. We will be exploring our senses through a range of activities within our stimulating, enabling environments.

Below are some examples of activities and topics we will be learning about in the upcoming term.

Goldilocks and the Three Bears: To be familiar with the story and experiment with mark making with different materials. Making scrumptious porridge for breakfast to take home and try.

The Three Little Pigs: Making different houses out of junk modelling. Using lots of different construction materials of all shapes and sizes to make the pigs a new, stronger house to keep them safe.
