This funding is to be used for PE and school sport and is ring-fenced subject to OFSTED framework and review.

Wilkinson Primary School uses the following rationale to ensure appropriate spending of the Sports Premium Grant:

- The increase in participation rates in such activities as games, dance, gymnastics, swimming and athletics.
- The increase and success in competitive school sports.
- How much more inclusive the physical education curriculum has become.
- The growth in the range of provisional and alternative sporting activities.
- The improvement in partnership work on physical education with other schools and other local partners.
- Links with other subjects that contribute to pupils' overall achievement and their greater social, spiritual, moral and cultural skills.
- The greater awareness amongst pupils about the dangers of obesity, smoking and other such activities that undermine pupils' health.

Impact of Sports Premium 2018-19

Action	Impact
Minibuses	Increased number of sport sessions and pupils are able to access off site facilities. Increased number of pupils able to attend training sessions and fixtures.
Football	Weekly WASPS League (boys football). Wolves Training Academy – 5 a side boys and girls football tournaments. Wilkinson made it into the 5 a side finalists.
Cricket	Boys and girls weekly sessions at Bert Williams throughout Autumn and Spring Term. Cricket Tournaments were organised by WASPS and local matches were held in Summer Term.
Cross Country	Cross Country runners took part in relay competitions in October and January and won the boys relay race in January. The boys also won the Town Championships in March.
Athletics	Selected children participated in Athletics at Aldersley Stadium. They took part in the town athletic championships. Children have qualified to go forward to the finals evening.
Dance	Dance workshops were organised which were linked to World Book Day. 2 days of dance workshops stimulated by literature. Indian Dance workshop was organised for year 2 and children learnt different styles of dancing.
Outdoor Learning / Gardening Project	This year children at Wilkinson have enjoyed learning about their school environment. Children from year 3, 4 and 5 have grown a wide range of fruit and vegetables in our school garden. They have cleared and maintained the nature/pond area and many other outdoor activities. The children have learnt many skills with the support of two gardening experts from “The Walled Garden Project”. They have developed a wide range of transferrable skills and are now excited to be able to sell their produce to the parents and families of the children at Wilkinson.
After School / Lunchtime Clubs	Children are encouraged to participate in lunchtime clubs and after school clubs which include dance, cricket, rounders, tennis, cross country, outdoor learning, sports club, football.

Sustainability of Activities

With the Sports Premium, pupils at Wilkinson will be able to continue to participate in a wide range of activities that otherwise would be unavailable to children in school. Sports premium allows school to buy in expertise over and above what would normally be available to children in school. Sports premium also allows children to attend events around the borough that again would not be possible without such funding. All sporting events will be continued annually.

Many of our runners from Cross Country Club are now also attending running clubs after school too. This illustrates the strength of running at Wilkinson.

During after school and lunchtime clubs all children are encouraged to participate and a buddy system is introduced for less confident pupils to allow them to participate.

We hope to continue to maintain our garden and outdoor area so that the children are able to continue to develop their gardening skills whilst also broadening their enterprise knowledge and also learning about healthy living lifestyles.

It is via such events that children have experiences that will stay with them forever and help to build them into fully rounded adults.
